What We're Learning This Week

"ELISHA AND THE ARMY" 2 KINGS 6

God opened the eyes of Elisha's servant so he could see God's protection. God is always with us. Jesus came to earth as the visible image of our invisible God. God's protection from sin and death is given to everyone who trusts in Jesus

Questions to Ask, Conversation Starters, and Helping to Apply The Truths to Our Kids' Lives

Remember: this guide is meant to help facilitate conversations and engagement with Jesus throughout the week, so don't feel like you need to do this all in one day!

BEFORE WE MEET TOGETHER ON SUNDAY

- Continue conversations as a family regarding the lesson from last Sunday, where we learned that God gave Elisha the same spirit that was in Elijah so Elisha could carry out his mission as a prophet. Years later, Jesus told His followers to wait for the Holy Spirit. God gives believers the Holy Spirit so they can share the gospel with the world. The guide from last week can be found [here](#).
- Read through 2 Kings 6. Pray and ask God to reveal Himself to you + for wisdom in how to best shepherd and disciple your kids through this Scripture in the next week.

AFTER WE MEET TOGETHER ON SUNDAY

Discipleship Through Scripture and Conversation

- Talk to your kids about the Bible story that they learned at church. Ask them to explain what they learned/what stuck out to them in the story, and expand upon the truths of the Bible that they are bringing up.
- Continue the conversation with your kids on Sunday and throughout the week. Some helpful conversations this week could be:
 1. Each time the king of Aram made plans to attack Israel, God revealed the plans to Elisha and he alerted Israel's king so Israel could thwart their enemy's plan. Elisha's servant saw the enemy army and was afraid, but Elisha could see something the servant couldn't see: an army of the Lord outnumbering the Arameans covered the mountain.

- Why was Elisha's servant afraid, and why was Elisha not afraid? How is God's character revealed by choosing to protect His people and by choosing to reveal His heavenly army to Elisha?
 - What does it look like to have courage even when we cannot see what God is doing?
2. God blinded the enemy army, and Elisha led them to Samaria where the king of Israel could have killed them. Instead, Elisha told the king to feed the men and send them home. Those raiders did not come into Israel's land again.
- How do we see God's mercy in this story? What does it tell us about who He is?
3. This story in 2 Kings 6 reveals that the world is not limited to what is seen.
- Are there things happening around us that we can't see? How do we know? And how should we engage with that?
 - Emphasize that God is always with us, even though we can't see Him.
 - How did God show Himself to the world?
 - Jesus came to earth so people could see God. (See Col. 1:15.) God protects us from sin and death when we trust in Jesus.

Discipleship through prayer

- Take time to pray together as a family.
 - Pray and thank God that He is a protector, He is merciful, and that through Jesus He has revealed Himself to the world.
- Ask each member of your family – adults included – to share one thing they would like prayer over. Have someone to pray for that person's request. Encourage your family to pray for that person for the entire week.
- Take time to pray independently for your children, for God to do his mighty work in their hearts through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Discipleship through modeling/action

- Follow up throughout the week about the things you discussed
- Pursue discipleship in your own life. Read Scripture, pray fervently, invest into community, and more. Model the ways of Christ as an example to your kids.

Our Memory Verse for This Unit

OUR MEMORY VERSE FOR THIS UNIT (ENTITLED “ELIJAH AND ELISHA”) IS ISAIAH 42:8

- *For our older kids we are doing the full verse:*

- "I am the LORD; that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to carved idols."
- *For our younger kids we are doing an abbreviated version of the verse:*
 - "I am the LORD...my glory I give to no other."

While we are helping the kids engage with this Scripture on Sundays through fun activities and time together, we really encourage you to take time to continue to engage with the memorization of this Scripture at home. As always, the hope is not to have our kids simply know a lot of Scripture, but to engage in God's Word and allow Him to use it to transform the hearts of our kids!
